#### Legislation and regulations

National School Law;

Pupils should have access to guidance before making choices for the future A school counsellor should have an education intended for such activities

National curriculum for compulsory schools;

The guidance counsellor should inform and guide the pupils with regard to further education and vocational orientation, with special focus on pupils with disabilities

- National curriculum for upper secondary schools;
   Guidance is important because of the rapid changes in working life
- Universities bound by law to provide guidance
- The Public Employment offices are to provide guidance to young people, newly arrived and those who are far from the labour market.
   Guidance is included in the PES's basic mission and it is regulated in several ordinances
- General guidelines for the work with guidance and counselling issued by the National Agency for Education
- Ethical standards for guidance developed by The Swedish Association of Guidance Counsellors







#### Educational background of Swedish guidance counsellors

- Three year university programme, 180 ECTS, leading to a professional degree in careers counselling, offered at 3 universities in Sweden;
   Malmö University, Stockholm University, Umeå University
- Master's Programme in Career Development and Career Counselling, 120 ECTS
- In-service training for guidance counsellors working at universities and university colleges
- In-service training for the personnel at Employment Offices
- Regular information meetings and further training days in some municipalities
- Further training courses at the University







#### **Development during the last years**

- **2007** Sweden joined the ELGPN National forum for cooperation between stakeholders in the area of guidance (2011)
- **2009** General guidelines and comments on career education and guidance in schools new guidelines **2013**
- **2011** Guidance becomes area for inspection by the Schools Inspectorate first evaluation 2013
- 2013- Investments in further training for guidance practitioners in schools2016 and quality assurance of guidance provision in schools
