A few facts about Denmark

- ❖ 5.6m inhabitants
- ❖ GDP in 2011 EUR 245 billion
- ❖ A constitutional monarchy with a representative democracy
- ❖ A modern welfare state
- ❖ Tax-financed social welfare
- ❖ A broad range of free public services
- ❖ High living standards
- ❖ Gender equality



The labour market

- ❖ The Danish labour force constitutes approx. 2.6 million people
- ❖ A high activity rate of approx. 73.6 % (2011)
- ❖ Men make up only slightly more than half of the labour force
- ❖ The gross unemployment rate is 6.3 % (16-24 years: 5.1%, highest for 25-29 years: 10.6%) (from Statistics Denmark, July 2012

- ❖ 30.5 % of all employed persons work in the public sector (2011)

- ❖ The Danish labour market model is based on the flexicurity model (flexibility and security)
- ❖ Tripartite cooperation between the state and the social partners




The Ministry of Employment

- Responsible for the legislation for 91 job centres (PES) in Denmark
- The job centres are operated by the Danish municipalities and they are responsible for guidance and support to all unemployed persons

I procent. Tallene er de nyeste tal fra Eurostat (Juni, 2015*)





Eurostat: Unemployment rate in Europe – 2015








Figure 1.1 The mainline Danish education system











Long-cycle higher education



Upper secondary education programmes



Primary and lower secondary school

Compulsory education begins at the age of 7 (form 1) and ends after form 9 (age 15). The 10th year is voluntary.

The term "youth education" is used as an umbrella term for all upper secondary and vocational education and training programmes (age 16-19).





Guidance

- The Ministry is responsible for the 7 Regional Guidance Centres (Studievalg) providing guidance to higher education programmes

Youth education (Upper secondary education)

- In 2013: 93% of a youth cohort in Form 9 are expected to pass a youth education as a minimum
- Challenge in 2014:
- 70% of a youth cohort in general upper secondary education
- 19% of a youth cohort in vocational training and education



Guidance

The Ministry of Education is responsible for several laws on guidance in education.

Eg. for the laws concerning the 51 independent municipal Youth Guidance Centres, providing guidance to young persons until the age of 25 in relation to upper secondary education.

VET reform 2014

- "Better and more attractive vocational educations"
- Addresses challenges: too few choose VET (19% in 2014) and the dropout rate is very high (almost 50%)

Targets of the previous government:

- Min. 25% of a youth cohort should choose VET directly after form 9 or 10 in 2020, 30% in 2025
- Min. 60% should complete in 2020, min. 67 % in 2025
- New VET education for adults over 25



Guidance reform 2014

- Guidance should be focused on the 20 % of the pupils, who are assessed not ready for education.
 - Use of group guidance and eGuidance for the strong pupils instead of individual guidance
 - Everyone should receive lessons in the topic ‘Education and job’
