 - We want to demonstrate to EU citizens that joint European projects have a real impact in terms of **improving their quality of life**.


2. Overcoming fragmentation

 - The ability to deliver concrete results and overcome fragmentation is the key to bringing the EU closer to its citizens.














(Council conclusions to be adopted at COMPET Council, November 2016)

✓ The Bratislava Declaration of Young Researchers

(written by excellent young researchers from all over EU in cooperation with SK PRES and EC, published on 18 July 2016 at the Informal COMPET Council meeting in Bratislava, and will be annexed to Council conclusions)

Calls on the Member States and the Commission to:

- enable great people to realise their ideas to understand and improve the world
- ensure sustainable and transparent career trajectories
- develop a diverse, collaborative, inter-disciplinary, open, and ethical research environment
- enable researchers to a enjoy healthy work-life balance







Youth

Promoting new approaches in youth work to uncover and develop the potential of young people

(Council conclusions to be adopted at EYCS Council, November 2016)

- young people **possess inner potential and talent** that may be of benefit to them as well as to the whole society; they are **striving to develop their potential, talents and creativity** in connection with active citizenship, personal development and employability;
- youth work has been used to **reach out** to young people, **youth work environment** should be stimulating, adaptive, attractive and responsive to new trends in the lives of young people and thus support them in **uncovering and developing their potential**, which can be often hidden and not apparent within formal education or in other sectors.

✓ EU Youth Conference in Košice, October 2016

 drafted and adopted 16 recommendations within the overall topic of 'Enabling young people to engage in a diverse, connected and inclusive Europe, among them the call for developing an education system that realises young people's potential

Flagship Conference on the Fostering and Development of Talent 12 – 13 September 2016, Bratislava

Key messages:

- ✓ Talent does not mean only high IQ, but it is also about creativity, curiosity, motivation, good memory, achievements, and passion;
- ✓ Quality and inclusive education respecting diversity, individual needs and specific circumstances of each child;
- ✓ Talent shall be assessed by a combination of methods that are part of a complex evaluating system based on research
- ✓ Whole school approach;
- ✓ Schools and educators need to be better prepared and more flexible to discover and support various kinds of talents
- ✓ Migration and the influx of people to Europe shall be seen as an opportunity;
- ✓ Crucial role of ECEC and early motivation;
- ✓ Involvement of all stakeholders & effective cooperation between them (public-private partnerships, educational institutions, business, parents, teachers,....);
- ✓ Investment into infrastructure and human resources;
- ✓ Development of a challenging, stimulating and supporting environment.
