

- Good data and research




## OESO related to Lifelong Guidance

- 4. Stronger cooperation and coordination mechanism needed.




#### 1. Improve access to professional/public career services

- The access to public career guidance services still needs improvement
- Focus digital services by Public Employment Service
- Career guidance services by regional Learning & Working service centers
- Career guidance in general education and vocational education and training obliged by law
- Different websites with relevant and objective information



## 2. Development of career management skills in education

- Improvement programmes in general education and VET (2010-2015)
- Focus on development of career management skills and guidance

#### 3. Development of evidence based material on 'what works'

- Past years lots of evidence gathered on the need for and impact of career guidance
- Research in different educational sectors
- Evidence based handbook ELGPN





#### 4. Stronger cooperation and coordination mechanism

- Acknowledgement of the need of career management skills
- National level: more coherent policy on career guidance in development between ministries of social affairs, education and social partners:
  - City Deal
  - Technique alliance
- Regional cooperation between education sectors on and with labour market have been developed:
  - Career guidance programmes/feedback student success/ better preparation of students for higher education
  - Better alignment of education with labour market: workshop Career Guidance South of Rotterdam



#### Were are we now:

- Interventions on early school leaving and switching are successful but remain a priority
- Further improvement is needed in:
  - the quality of career guidance in education
  - the transitions between education sectors is needed
  - The connection with the needs of the labour market



# Next Steps:

- Support of further improvement of career guidance in education
- Stimulation of feedbackmechanism between education level
- Support of regional cooperation between schools on preparing students for the transition to the next level
- Support of the regional cooperation also cross sectoral and exchange of good practises
- Regional investment funds in 2017 for improvement alignment between regional education and labour market
- Better student oriented objective career guidance information
