Skill definition

- A 'trained' craft
- Transfer: Exchange of knowledge, methods, practice examples, values & qualities between different sectors

+ Research Outcomes

Field analysis & practical collaborative explorations were analyzed. We found specific dance skills commonly transferred in:

- Bodily practices
- Empathizing different concepts of the mind
- Relating body and mind in behavior
- Navigating through space, to see different contexts within the same space
- Performative strategies, how to represent content to others
- Audience strategies

From the Alumni Survey:

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+ VISION 2020 FUTURE EDUCATION DEVELOPMENT

Inclusive Infrastructure for our dance education:

- I. Whole Person Development: our education is geared towards the development of an embodied and integrated understanding of our whole selves and the awareness of interconnectedness between self, others and the surrounding in which we live.
- 2. Craftsmanship: we put emphasis on the development of our craft, to be applied to different contexts, performed with authenticity and personal excellence, by committing ourselves to 'making the hands dirty' with perseverance, patience and creativity.
- 3. Learning community: by perceiving learning as a co-operative process we take responsibility for both our own and others' learning and for creating a safe environment in which multiple views and beliefs can exist side by side to yield meaningful artistic ideas, creations and knowledge.
- **4. Education in motion:** we facilitate education in resonance with both the needs of our learners and a context of choice, such that it is always relevant and enhances transfer of knowledge and skills.
- 5. Working in a healthy manner: we support the development of healthy, vital and 'whole' dancers that know how to unfold their talents and potential and contribute to artistic processes sustainably.
